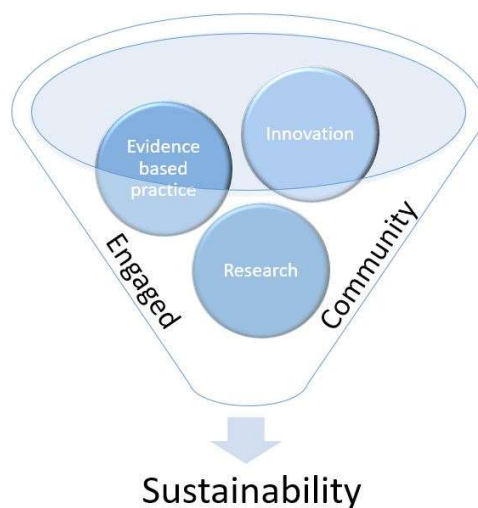


Figure 1: ASCILITE activities, foundational in progressing the sustainable use of educational technologies to progress pedagogical practice
