

ASCILITE FELLOW AWARD NOMINATION CRITERIA

DESCRIPTION

The ASCILITE Fellow Award aims to recognise the outstanding contributions of individual ASCILITE members in the exemplary use of, and/or research into, technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education. The nature of these contributions will be in at least two of the following categories:

- Professional mentoring that encourages and supports the exemplary use of technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education.
- Professional leadership in the development, application or implementation of exemplary technology-related projects for teaching and learning in tertiary education.
- Sustained innovations in practice in the exemplary use of technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education.
- Quality research in the use of technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education leading to significant new knowledge and/or understandings.

CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION

Nominations an ASCILITE Fellow Award are invited from members. Self-nominations are accepted and encouraged. An ASCILITE Fellow, once awarded, remains a Fellow and is eligible to use the title accordingly. All applicants must be a current member of ASCILITE and have been a member of ASCILITE for a minimum of three (3) years.

AWARD CRITERIA

Selection for the ASCILITE Fellow Award is judged on merit by the ASCILITE Executive against the following criteria. The nominee will:

1. Have made a significant contribution to the exemplary use of technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education in one of the above categories; and/or

2. Have made a significant contribution to the exemplary research into technologies for teaching and learning in tertiary education in one of the above categories; and
3. Through their contributions have promoted the strategic goals and vision of ASCILITE.

ENTITLEMENT

The ASCILITE Fellow Award is a reflection of peer esteem from colleagues within the tertiary sector and the ASCILITE community. Successful applicants are announced at the ASCILITE annual conference and recipients are presented with a formal certificate of recognition. Awardees will be informed in advance of the event and would normally be expected to attend the conference in person to receive their award. There is a maximum of three Fellow awards in any given year.

Fellows who undertake a set of agreed activities would also be eligible for a complimentary conference registration the following year.

EXPECTATIONS

An ASCILITE Fellow will be expected to perform a number of agreed activities as an “ASCILITE champion” in the year following their award. Fellows would negotiate with an ASCILITE executive member the details of the activities that they will carry out as an ASCILITE Fellow. This negotiation will occur post the Fellow being awarded and prior to the start of the following year.

Negotiated activities would comprise at least three of the following activities:

- Championing and/or leading an ASCILITE activity institutionally, regionally, in the sector, in Australasia and/or internationally
- Mentoring an Early Career Researcher, or equivalent and co-Presenting a joint paper/s at an ASCILITE conference
- Conducting an ASCILITE webinar
- Facilitating an ASCILITE regional workshop
- Initiating/leading activities in an ASCILITE Special Interest Group (SIG)
- Convening an ASCILITE conference/ chairing the program committee
- Leading or making a significant contribution to an ASCILITE committee, working or reference group or project
- Write a blog post for the ASCILITE TELall Blog
