All submissions must use the template indicated for the submission type using the submission tool EasyChair. We've created a <u>guide to using EasyChair [PDF]</u> to help you with the submission process.

Formatting Requirements

For the main text of your submission, please use:

- Arial 10 point font
- Single line spacing
- APA 6th style for referencing

Submissions can be made in Microsoft Word, RT or OpenOffice Document file format, but must preserve the table at the top of the submission template.

Double Blind Peer Reviewed Submissions

Full Paper

Full Papers may feature significant theoretical reviews, research studies in areas of emergent or innovative educational practice, case studies, evaluations or projects. Full Papers are expected to present quality research and require that the paper be original and have the potential to produce results that are sufficiently general for theoretical and/or practical knowledge to be recognisably increased. Accepted Full Papers will be allocated a 25 minute presentation slot in the final program. Full Paper submissions are a maximum of 10 pages, including references.

Concise Paper

Concise Papers are around work in progress for pilot studies, small-scale exploratory projects, and reports on highly specialized topics or conceptual papers on recent development. Concise Papers also encompass reviews of key new directions for developing research-based best practices and for conducting research into practices in technology supported teaching and learning. Accepted Concise Papers will be allocated a 15 minute presentation slot in the final program. Concise Paper submissions are a maximum of 5 pages.

Double blind peer review

Digital Poster

Posters offer visual representations of projects and development initiatives that provide opportunities for conference delegates to discuss the topic with presenters. Posters enable individuals or groups to display information about innovative projects or activities in an informal, interactive environment. Digital Poster submissions are a maximum of 1 page, including references. A poster session will be scheduled as part of the final program.

Double Peer (Not Blind) Reviewed Submissions

Debate

A Debate involves two debaters critically explore a hot topic. Each debater presents his or her opposing view about the topic. The audience votes on which debater provided the most compelling view or argument. For example a hot topic could be "technology has made universities redundant". Accepted Debates will be allocated a 25 minute presentation slot in the final program. Debate submissions are a maximum of 2 pages, including references.

Double peer All Debate submissions are double peer reviewed; they are review not blind reviewed.

Please ensure your submission includes:

- the question to be debated
- a brief explanation of the issue
- short biographies of the two debaters

Lightning Talk

Lightning Talks are opportunities to provide a very short overview of a project, showcase a technology or implementation, or highlight a key issue. Presentations are strictly limited to 5 minutes. Lightning Talk submissions are a maximum of 1 page, including references.

Content Provide a 1 page overview of your presentation.

Lightning Round

A Lightning Round features 3 to 4 short presentations (for example 5 minutes) by different speakers all critically exploring the same topic, from different perspectives. Accepted Lightning Rounds will be allocated a 25 minute presentation slot in the final program. Lightning Round submissions are a maximum of 2 pages, including references.

Double peer All Lightning Round submissions are double peer review reviewed; they are not blind reviewed.

Experimental Sessions

Experimental sessions are about going beyond the traditional 'sage on the stage' format. These sessions have a primary focus on encouraging delegate engagement and participation. Examples may include demonstrations, performances, installations, design sessions, unsessions, maker or hackathons, or interactive experiences. Sessions might result in the creation of outputs such as videos, learning objects or writings, to further emphasise engagement. The time slot allocated to accept Experimental Sessions in the final program can span a 25 to 50 minute timeframe, depending on type of session proposed. Experimental Session submissions are a maximum of 2 pages, including references.

Double peer review

All Experimental Sessions submissions are double peer reviewed; they are not blind reviewed. The submissions will also be reviewed by the conference committee in order to ensure their feasibility in the local setting of the conference.

Please ensure your submission includes:

- a brief statement on the goal or idea of the session and how it will operate
- names and biographies of the organisers of the session

Logistics

The organisers of experimental sessions will be responsible for supplying any necessary equipment beyond

that usually provided for conference presentations, and should be prepared to coordinate closely with the conference committee as necessary to enable a successful presentation of the alternative format.

- title of workshop
- description of workshop including purpose and intended audience, proposed format, workshop goals or outcomes
- Content
- names and biographies of the organisers of the workshop
- an overview of how the session fits the ASCILITE 2017 theme.
